# Frank Sinatra: The Blueprint for Success & Legacy

Grade Level: 9-12 Time: ~20 minutes

### Objective:

Students will analyze Frank Sinatra's impact on music, entertainment, and cultural identity while exploring how public figures shape their own legacy.

### Step 1: Meet Frank Sinatra (5 min)

### **Fun Fact:**

Sinatra refused to perform in clubs that **discriminated against Black artists**, helping break racial barriers in entertainment. How did this contribute to the expansion of music and impact for all artists?

### **Quick Question:**

What makes an entertainer iconic? Is it talent, personality, influence, or something else?

#### **Your Challenge:**

- Listen to (or read the lyrics of) "My Way."
- Analyze a key lyric. What does it say about Sinatra's approach to life?
- Write a short essay (5-6 sentences) about a modern figure who, like Sinatra, built a legacy on their own terms.

### **Think About:**

- How do artists today shape their **public image**?
- What does it mean to have a lasting impact on culture?
